Impacts of COVID-19 to RIPTA Financial Impacts

- Through May 2020 (Fiscal Year 2020):
 - Passenger Revenues are under budget by \$3,692,048
 - Paratransit Passenger Revenues are under budget by \$851,438
- Between now and FY 2025, RIPTA expects to lose between \$50-\$80 Million
 - Loss expected of \$10.9 million in FY 2020 and \$11.2 million in 2021
 - Permanent declines in both gas tax and passenger revenue expected
- Additional costs incurred to ensure buses and facilities are frequently cleaned and to enable remote working for administrative staff

Impacts of COVID-19 to RIPTA Service Impacts

- Fixed route service has largely been un-impacted by COVID-19.
- Underutilized paratransit service has been redeployed:
 - Support fixed route service overcrowding
 - Meal delivery for Meals on Wheels of Rhode Island
 - Transporting Honeywell employees
 - Operating the Little Roady autonomous shuttle pilot
 - Meal delivery with the RI Office of Healthy Aging

- As ridership returns, RIPTA may re-deploy resources to meet demand, if needed.
 - Potentially reduce service on low-performing routes to add frequency on busier routes to accommodate social distancing
 - RIPTA is also exploring opportunities to expand service.

CARES Act Overview

- Passed by Congress and signed into law on March 27, 2020.
- Provides \$2 Trillion in emergency funding across many sectors.
- \$25 Billion included for public transit across the country.
- RIPTA received \$91,233,702.
- RIDOT received \$13,346,035.



- Funding supports "capital, operating, and other expenses generally eligible under those programs to prevent, prepare for, and response to COVID-19."
 - transit.dot.gov/cares-act
- Funds can cover costs dating back to January 20, 2020, and funding has no expiration dates.

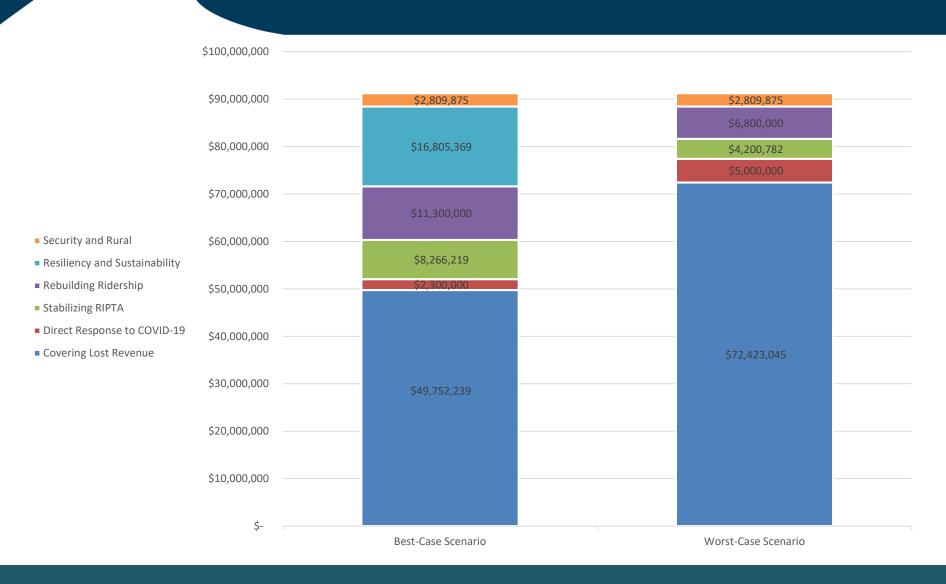
- RIPTA has received \$91,233,702 from the Federal government in response to the COVID-19 crisis.
- RIPTA staff, in consultation with RIDOT and the Governor's office, have created a spending plan that focuses on five key areas:
 - Covering Lost Revenue
 - Direct Response to COVID-19
 - Stabilizing RIPTA
 - Rebuilding Ridership
 - Resiliency and Sustainability

- Projects that are a direct response to COVID-19 include:
 - Purchasing and leasing additional vehicles to grow service

- Projects to stabilize RIPTA include:
 - Orders for new vehicles (2021 and 2022) and improvements to the East Side Bus Tunnel will be matched by revenues from the state's gas tax.
 - On-going operations for RIPTA will be funded with CARES Act funding.
 - Provide funds for potential cost overruns on the Pawtucket/Central Falls Transit
 Hub that are directly related to COVID-19

- Projects to rebuild RIPTA's ridership include:
 - Development of a marketing campaign
 - Targeted promotions to reduce fares
 - Expanding service

- Projects to focusing on resiliency and sustainability include:
 - Upgrades to RIPTA's IT systems
 - Deployment of WAVE readers on RIde vehicles
 - Investments in passenger-facing technologies
 - Improvements to bus stops across the state
 - Upgrades to RIPTA's campus
- In addition to the five areas, RIPTA must spend a portion of CARES funds on projects specifically related to security and service in rural areas.



Opportunities Created with CARES Act Funds

- While COVID-19 has had catastrophic impacts on the transit industry, the CARES Act presents real opportunity for RIPTA, including potential projects:
 - Expansion of RIPTA's Wave Fare Collection system to new markets
 - Infusion of funding to the Pawtucket/Central Falls Bus Hub
 - Additional resources for RIPTA's Zero Emissions Vehicle pilot program
 - Creation of a community van program

Opportunities Created with CARES Act Funds

- Many projects within RIPTA were unimpacted by COVID-19, including:
 - Chafee Maintenance Facility Modernization Project (\$6.6M)
 - URI/CCRI Bus Hub Project (\$10.1M)
 - Quonset Bulkhead Improvements (\$0.7M)
